A “BIG” thank you goes out to all the Legionnaires that have paid their 2019 dues already. Our 2019 year started on July 1, 2018. We have a long way to go so please keep submitting your dues payments.

Please take a moment pull out your membership cards and see what year it is valid for. I ran a report and there are 283 members that have not paid dues since 2017 and 198 that have not paid their 2018 dues. The Newsletters have still been coming to you, but we must keep down the printing and mailing costs and only send to those that are active/dues paying members. 
We are still receiving requests for motorcycle escorts for our departed members and we will continue to do so.
